Dear Students,

Welcome to our advanced-level course in English. This course focuses on doing research and writing a degree thesis in English with a didactic emphasis. This means that students will plan, carry out, and present an advanced-level scholarly work based on English language or literature teaching at upper secondary level. The course features the defense of the student's own thesis and the critical review of another student's corresponding work.

The course consists of individual or group advising sessions, instead of lectures and seminars. The advisor may, however, recommend students to attend lectures and/or seminars if they are deemed necessary for students to achieve the learning objectives mentioned in the syllabus (see the link to the course syllabus in the course information at the beginning of this document). An individual schedule for advising sessions will be set up by the instructor together with the student.

Since this is a campus course, the advising sessions will take place on campus. Communication with the students will be carried out primarily through the Blackboard course site. Course materials, recordings, links, and other relevant documents will be posted there as well.

It is important that you inform the course coordinator about your intentions to write your thesis in language or literature teaching. Please contact Marko Modiano via e-mail (mmo@hig.se) and let him know your choice by January 24.
