Dear student,

Welcome to “Advanced Management” fall 2015!

This time our discussions on Advanced Management will be interwoven with three themes, (1) conflict, (2) communication and (3) change. These three themes will be examined individually and in teams of 7-9 persons.

THEME 1 – Management and conflict

During this section of the course we will highlight how diversity among professional employees can support learning interactions, give input to personal development but also, many times, trigger really stressful internal conflicts and heighten emotions hard to manage.

All discussions will be moderated in close reference to the concept “Diversity” and theories of diverse identities in organizations.

THEME 2 – Management and communication

During this section of the course we will examine how dramatized communication and vivid narratives can support and direct co-workers loyalty and commitment but also create powerful contextual movements difficult to manage. How evolving organizational culture and the atmosphere of a business can promote excellent performance, but also lead to dramatic personal failures that should have been avoided.

All discussions will be moderated in close reference to the concept “Aesthetics” and research dealing with the aesthetic side of organizational life. There will also be opportunities to expand previous discussions on management and conflict.

THEME 3 – Management and change

In this course section we will critically investigate research that explains how changes can be implemented and how untried creative solutions affects existing practices and procedures.

All discussions during this course section will be moderated in close reference to the concept “Innovation” and research that describes the organizing of innovation processes. There will also be opportunities to expand previous discussions on management, conflict and communication.
